Marina Klein is a Professor of Medicine at McGill University, Montreal, Canada, in the Division of Infectious Diseases/Chronic Viral Illnesses Service, where she is Research Director. She graduated from McGill Medical School in 1991 and trained in internal medicine at the Royal Victoria Hospital in Montreal. She completed a research fellowship in infectious diseases at the University of Minnesota in 1998 and then did a postdoc with the Canadian HIV Trials Network. She received a Masters in epidemiology and biostatistics from McGill in 2003. Her clinical interests focus on treatment of people with HIV and chronic viral hepatitis.

Dr Klein is a prominent researcher of clinical and epidemiologic aspects of HIV and hepatitis C co-infection. She has been a principal investigator in many clinical trials and has worked towards accessing liver transplantation for co-infected people in Canada. She is also involved in a number of observational epidemiologic research collaborations focused on understanding long-term clinical and treatment outcomes in HIV and HIV-HCV co-infection. Dr Klein is National Co-Director of the Canadian Institutes of Health Research – Canadian HIV Trials Network (CIHR-CTN) and Co-Leader of its Co-infections and Concurrent Diseases Core. She is currently International AIDS Society Governing Council representative for the North American region.
